The Lounge Committee recently discussed and made a change in the Lounge Committee Rules. This changed was passed by the Executive Board and moved forward to the Post membership at the March meeting and was passed. The change was made in the following:

.From the Judge Advocate

ARTICLE VIII – HALL PRICING and RULES

SECTION 3: The reserving parties will be responsible for obtaining their own catering (if applicable). All catering companies must be licensed and insured. Catering companies will not be allowed the use of the hall kitchen for any reason.

As with any of our Constitution and By-Laws, Standing Rules, Lounge Rules, you can have an officer of the Post to print you a copy, or on the Post 4 web-site under the heading of "Constitution and By-Laws, Standing Rules". I will post the new flyer on the board in the Post. **The PACT Act** is a law that expands VA health care and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic substances. This law helps us provide generations of Veterans—and their **<u>survivors</u>**—with the care and benefits they've earned and deserve. And starting **March 5, 2024**, we're expanding VA health care to millions of Veterans—years earlier than called for by the PACT Act.

This page (<u>www.VA.gov</u>) will help answer your questions about what the PACT Act means for you or your loved ones. You can also call us at (<u>800) 698-2411 (TTY: 711)</u>. And you can file a claim for PACT Act-related disability compensation or apply for VA health care now.

Helping the Homeless Community

Mr. Don Onyskow, a U.S.Navy veteran, administers a backpack program for the homeless community focusing primarily on veterans but not a single person is turned down in their time of need. This labor of love is run out of his basement all for the love of his fellow man. Don Onvskow does not ask for nor look for any recognition for this endeavor. In fact, he has constantly our brothers and sisters. fought against having any praise thrown at him. Don does this out of love for his brothers and sisters of this great nation who have fallen on tough just a sample of the volunteers that show up and times through no fault of their own or have cho- help. There are too many names to put in this arsen to live homeless by choice.

Don praises the entire volunteer corps that help him keep the program moving forward. The program relies and depends on donations of products, monetary funds, and time. The volunteers pack the bags in an assembly line style operation in Don's basement. Each pack contains approximately seventy-five articles that a person would need from personal hygiene products to items that keep the mind active like crossword puzzle books.

In the last 2.5 years, 330 backpacks have been issued out of the basement and transported to the distribution center by Mr. Walter Setters.

The genesis of the project was Don's daughter-in -law, Christy Onyskow. During the Covid-19 outbreak, Christy was handing out backpacks from her own vehicle but was told to cease and desist due to security concerns about her handing out backpacks from her trunk. Don told her that he would take over and assume the responsibility for getting the backpacks to the masses that needed relief with his network of community contacts. As stated earlier, Don does not wish for the recognition but deflects it to the myriad of team members that donate their time and labor.

What made this a Labor of Love for him was getting to see the impact of his efforts first hand and seeing how much this act of generosity and kindness had on one veteran with his own eyes.
