The Early Bird sticker on your card entitles you to a turkey dinner on Sunday, Nov. 09.2025 at the Post. That also includes the S.A.L. members who are early birds. The member is free, and it is \$10.00 for your guest. Neither long program nor speeches; 1:00pm gathering and fellowship, dinner at 2:00pm. We will be initiating all members who have never taken the oath of membership.

Membership is important to the life of the American Legion and sadly it has been on the decline, not just for our Post, but the whole Legion. We reached 94.97% in 2025. Let's ,try for A 100%. We could obtain 100% if each of you sign up a new member or encourage a reluctant member to pay their dues. There are three ways that you can pay your dues: online at MichiganLegion.org, mail to the Post or put it in the box in the Lounge marked Post #4.

To be a member in Good Standing, your dues need to be paid and **recorded** by Dec. 31, 2025.

Recognizing a need is important—but taking action to address it is what truly makes a difference. Don Onyskow of American Legion Post 4 in Mt. Clemens not only identified the urgent needs of homeless veterans but also committed himself to doing something about it.

Today, far too many veterans in the United States struggle without access to even their most basic necessities. Determined to help, Don developed a plan to provide local homeless veterans with essential items—by filling backpacks with toiletries, socks, tarps, snacks, and other everyday necessities.

Since October 2022, with the support of his family, generous monetary contributions, and donations from local businesses and vendors, Don has organized the assembly and distribution of 600 new backpacks—each carefully filled with supplies. Valued at more than \$48,800 collec-

tively, these backpacks have been packed and shipped directly from Don's basement. Members of Post 4 have also dedicated their time to assist in filling and distributing them. While most backpacks are prepared with male veterans in mind, special consideration has also been given to create backpacks tailored for female veterans.

Distribution takes place coordinated by Walt Setters through several charitable organizations, including Harvest Time Christian Church, Motor City Mitten Mission, Trinity Lutheran Church, and Peace Lutheran Church. By the end of this year, Don anticipates that at least 30 additional backpacks will be provided through these partnerships.

Through dedication, compassion, and countless hours of effort, Don and Walt have transformed an idea into meaningful action, bringing relief and dignity to veterans who have served our nation.
